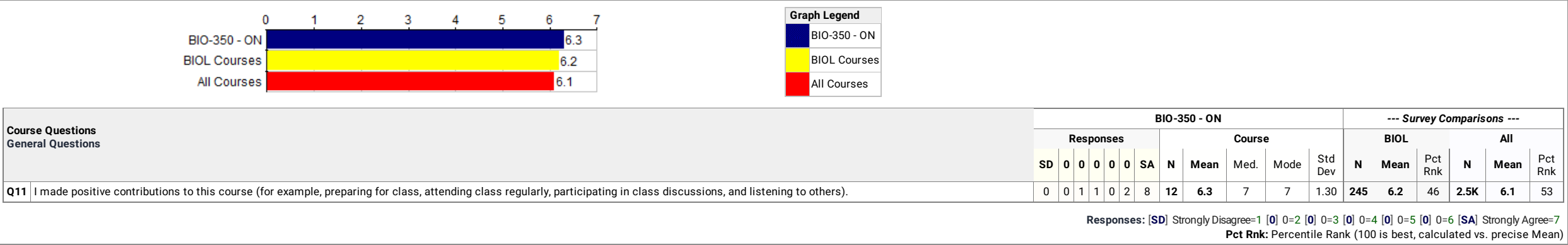
1	This course was very challenging and I learned so much!

9	During Dr. Dutton's lessons, she would do a quick review before we got into the in-class activity and that was very helpful.



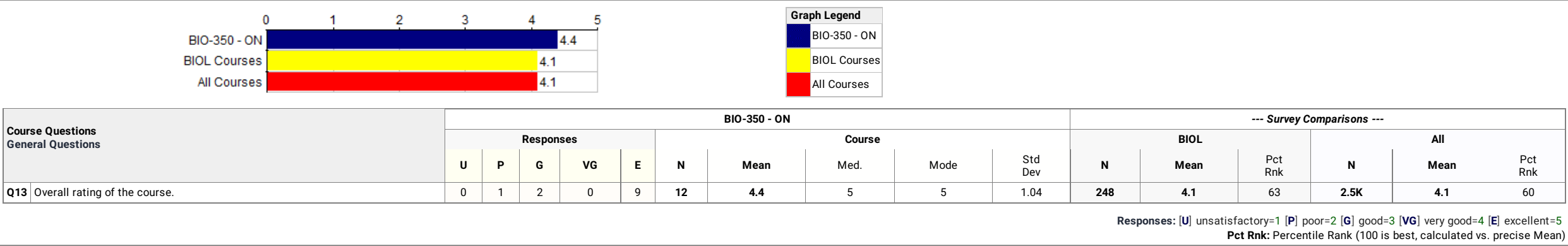
Q8 - Please explain or comment on the question above.

8	Everything served a purpose.



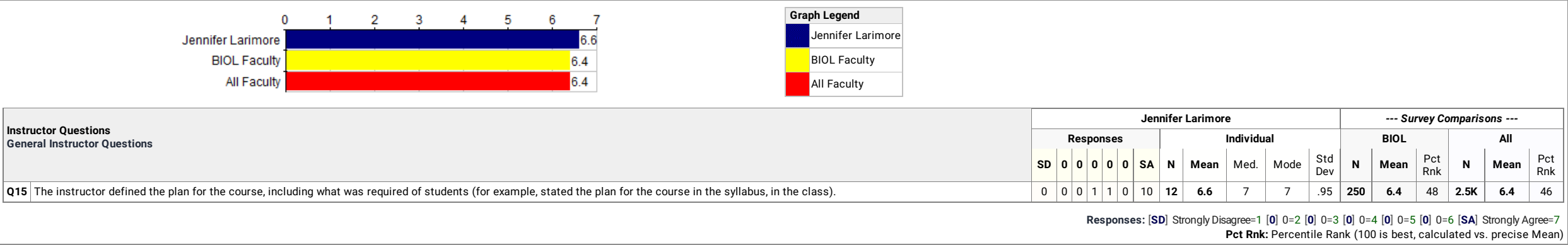
Q10 - Please explain or comment on the question above.

7	I feel like I worked hard in this class and it was challenging but doable for me



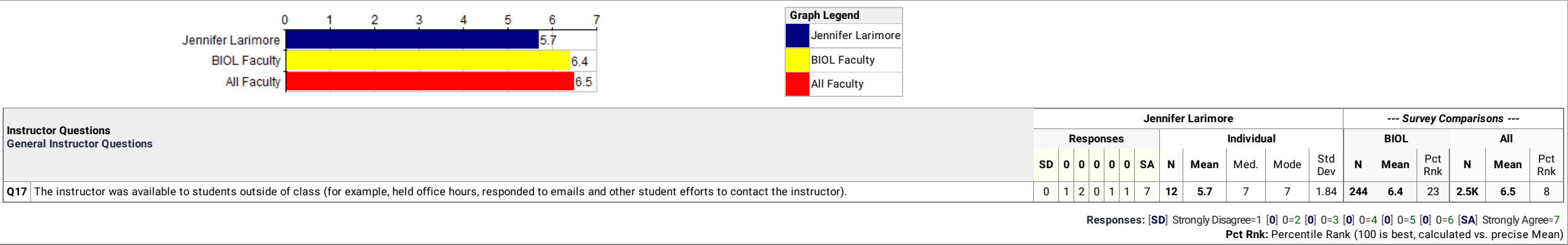
Q12 - Please explain or comment on the question above.

7	I always spoke up in class (mostly because I was engaged with the content and partly because I HATE awkward silences). I always had my camera on and engaged with others.



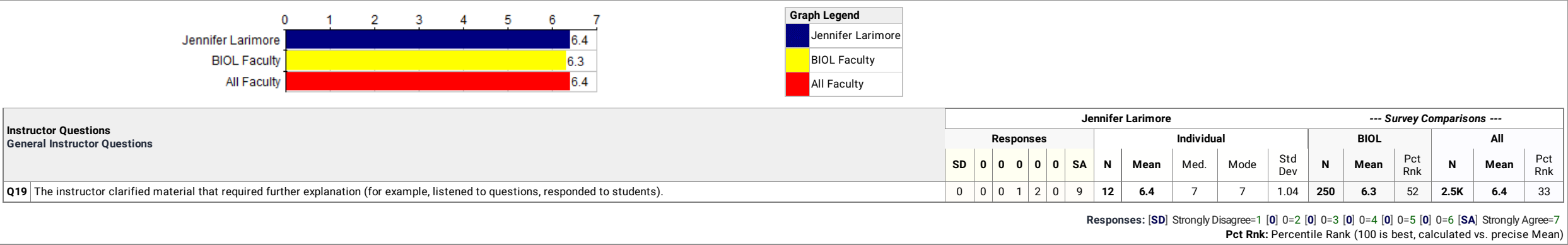
Q14 - Please explain or comment on the question above.

6	I like this course overall. It was designed well and surprisingly adaptable to this online setting.



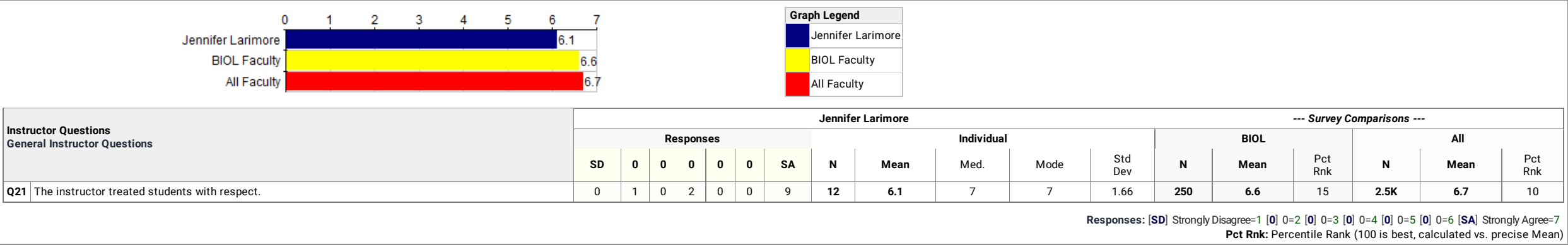

5	Her and Dr. Dutton were very organized in terms of planning the content of the course



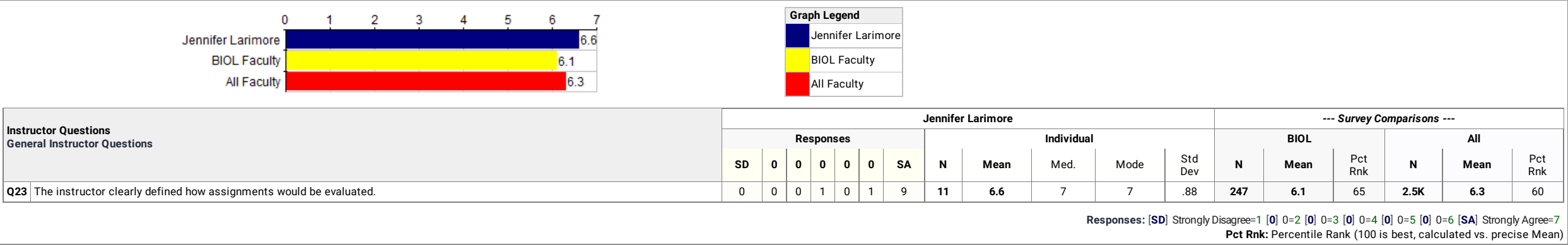
Q18 - Please explain or comment on the question above.

8	Always readily available and communicated schedule.



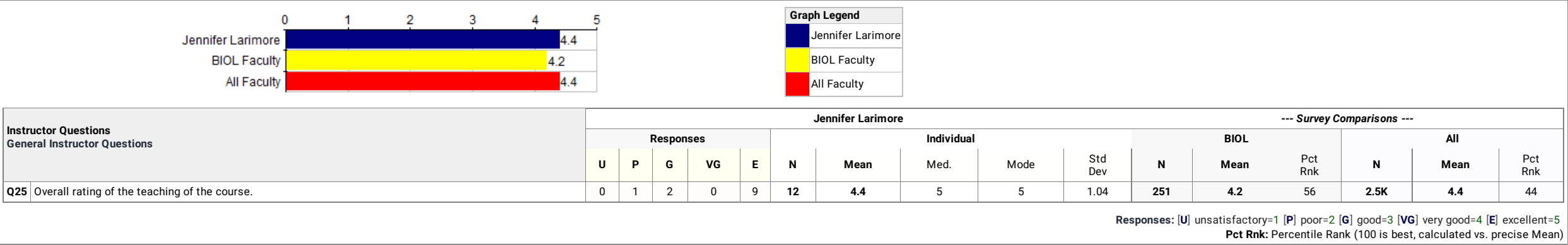
Q20 - Please explain or comment on the question above.
